On Friday, 3rd November at 8pm, the RTÉ National Symphony Orchestra is joined by Ladies of the RTÉ Philharmonic Choir and RTÉ Cór na nÓg, in presenting:

Symphony No. 3 in D minor by Gustav Mahler

Mahler's Third Symphony is an uplifting hymn to nature, ranging from the majestic to the intimate, and one of the composer's most dramatic works. The piece is performed in concert less often than Mahler's other symphonies, due to the huge ensemble -- large orchestra, choirs and soloist -- it requires. This year's concert in the NCH provides a rare opportunity to experience a live performance of this unique work.

Committee Member, Cliona Golden is organising this event and will allocate tickets on a first come, first served basis. The concert will be preceded by a thirty-minute talk on the music by Ian Fox at 6.45pm. After the concert, members and visiting Fulbrighters will gather for drinks at Alfie Byrne's bar in the Hotel Conrad, across the road from the NCH. Annual General Meeting

The A.G.M. for 2006 was held in the elegantly restored Georgian home of Boston College, in Dublin's St Stephen's Green on 3rd May. In opening the meeting, the President, Prof. William Reville expressed the gratitude of the Association to Dr Mike Cronin, Academic Director of the College for the hospitality offered to the members.

Prof. Reville welcomed all present, particularly the alumni for whom this was a first AGM. The IFAA is now 11 years old and from small beginnings, and close identity with the Irish Fulbright Commission it has grown in independence and confidence. During the year a new logo had been commissioned - an emblem symbolising friendship in a celtic sort of way with a hint of an academic scroll. An IFAA web-site is proposed and, with the ubiquity of e-mail addresses, electronic distribution of the newsletter is being considered. Prof. Reville stressed the importance of the Fulbright programme to education in Ireland with approximately 200 posts in Third Level Institutions - being currently filled by Fulbright Alumni.

Reports from the Hon. Secretary, the Hon. Treasurer and the Hon. Membership Secretary were considered and approved.

Two new members were welcomed to the Executive Committee: Dr Cliona Golden (1999, Applied Maths, Princeton) and Dr Aidan Kennedy. (1972, Catalytic Chemistry, Northwestern University, Chicago, Illinois).

Prof. Val Rice

It is with great sadness we record the death of Professor John Valentine Rice, who was President of the IFAA from 1999-2001.

Val was one of the enthusiastic group that formed the founding committee of the IFAA and many of the early meetings were held in his office in Trinity College, where he was Professor of Higher Education and of Education Research. His whole-hearted support of the Fulbright idea and the Alumni Association arose from his own experience of studying in Harvard in the early 60s where he took his M.Ed. and Ed.D. degrees. Some years later he used the Harvard model in setting up the M.Ed. programme in Trinity College, the first in Ireland. Val was always a charming and friendly person but "the velvet scabbard held a sword of steel". He could fight hard for what he believed in, and did particularly on issues relating to academic standards and to Ireland's heritage. A long standing member of An Taisce and 'defender of the Liffey Valley', he helped to persuade Fingal County Council to change its plans for a waterworks extension at Leixlip so as to preserve a reputed Viking site. When excavated this turned out to be both fruitful and important and very recently, although Val was never to know it, archaeologists on the site have found quartz construction dating back to Neolithic times..

Another successful campaign saved the Rice House in Dingle from depredation and has preserved it for future possible use as a French-Irish heritage centre. This was the home of an ancestor, a wealthy Catholic wine importer who sent his children to Europe for education. His son, James Louis Rice who was later a Count of the Holy Roman Empire, studied at Louvain and became a lifelong friend of one of the brothers of Marie Antoinette. At the brother's request, the Count put together a plan to rescue the Queen and bring her to Ireland on one of the wine ships. Her jailers were bribed and the teams of horses ready to bring her to the coast, but at the last moment the King and Queen were separated and she opted not to escape without him. The plan had to be abandoned and she stayed to meet her fate. Val told me this story while he was campaigning to save the Rice House, with undisguised pride in his Kerry Catholic heritage.

His Carmelite friend, Fr John Follent had planned for some time to fly from Australia on September 27th. He was thus in Ireland to concelebrate Requiem Mass for Val with a very large and ecumenical attendance on 28th September 2006 at St Teresa's Church in Clarendon Street, Dublin. The burial took place in Abbeydorney, in his beloved Kerry. *Requiescat in Pace.*

He is survived by his wife Ellen, two sons, David and Jonathan and one daughter, Elizabeth.
